Our work with human rights is based on the 10 principles of the UN Global Compact and the main underlying conventions: The Declaration of Human Rights, the International Labour Organisation's Declaration of Fundamental Principles and the Rights at Work, the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development and the UN Convention against corruption.

Renta complies with the laws and regulations of the countries in which we operate while simultaneously conducting our business and encouraging the promotion of human rights through our own policies, standards, and practices.

These include:

- Our Code of Conduct, which underscores our values and our commitment to ensuring a
 workplace that supports equal opportunity, dignity, and respect. The Code applies to all
 Renta's employees and workers, including consultants, regardless of employment type,
 contract, and position.
- Our Business Code of Conduct, which defines the minimum standards that Renta requests suppliers, partners, and customers to abide by when conducting business with Renta.

Renta engages with stakeholders (including customers, suppliers, governments, financial institutions, nongovernmental organizations, and individuals) and employees on human rights issues on an ongoing and as needed basis. When expert help is needed that cannot be found internally, Renta works with well-known experts to solve questions and issues that arise.

By embracing these commitments and working collectively as a group with our subsidiaries, we strive to create a business environment that respects and protects the dignity, rights, and well-being of all individuals. Renta will continue to respect and support the promotion of human rights across our business globally, and we hope our actions will inspire such practices worldwide.
